

CHANGE OF AUTHORSHIP, CORRECTION & RETRACTION POLICY

The Journal follows the Code of Conduct recommended by [Committee on Publication Ethics \(COPE\)](#).

Change of Authorship

Any changes to the list of authors (addition, removal, or reordering) must be agreed upon by all authors and justified in writing to the Editorial Office. Requests for authorship changes are only considered before the paper is published online or in print. Once the article has been published, changes to authorship are generally not permitted, except in exceptional cases where there is clear evidence of an error or omission. The Editorial Office will evaluate each request in accordance with ethical guidelines and COPE recommendations.

Correction of Published Data

Authors are responsible for the accuracy of all data presented in their published paper. Before publication, the corresponding author receives a digital proof of the article and is required to check it carefully and return any corrections within three working days.

If, after publication, the authors identify a substantial error that affects the accuracy or interpretation of the data, they must notify the Editorial Office. In such cases, a correction (*erratum*) will be issued, and readers will be informed in the next issue of the journal.

Retraction of Published Papers

If, after publication, the authors discover a serious flaw that compromises the reliability of the results or the reproducibility of the research, they may request that the paper be retracted. In such cases, the online version of the article will remain accessible but marked as “*retracted by the authors*”.

If editors, reviewers, or readers determine that a paper (or part of it) has been previously published, contains falsified data, or violates ethical standards, the Editorial Board will investigate the matter and, if misconduct is confirmed, retract the paper. Such papers will be marked as “*retracted by the editors*”, with the online link remaining active.
